An Act

To name a certain Federal building in Santa Fe, New Mexico, the "Joseph M. Montoya Federal Building and U.S. Courthouse".

June 28, 1980

[H.R. 5259]

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Federal building located on Federal Place, in Santa Fe, New Mexico, shall hereafter be known as, and is hereby designated as, the "Joseph M. Montoya Federal Building and U.S. Courthouse". Any reference in any law, regulation, document, record, map, or other paper of the United States to such building shall be considered to be a reference to the Joseph M. Montoya Federal Building and U.S. Courthouse.
